5.1 PRO Kids Cheque Presentation & 2014 Annual Report - Evan & Shelley

Evan and Shelley Doucet were in attendance presenting a cheque to the PRO Kids Foundation from proceeds of the 1st Annual Quispamsis Run and Swim that was held at the qplex on June 27, 2015.

Mr. and Mrs. Doucet spoke to Council about their efforts in organizing this event for PRO Kids. They thanked those that helped them organize and participated in the event and thanked the Town for their contributions. Mr. and Mrs. Doucet and Councillor Gary Clark, PRO Kids Advisory Committee Vice-Chair, presented a cheque to David Dobbelsteyn, PRO Kids Manager, in the amount of \$4,054. Mr. Dobbelsteyn noted that this donation will give 25 children the opportunity to participate in arts, cultural, recreation, and sport activities.

5.2 Residents Concerns - Amendment 023-1 Noise Bylaw Of The Town Of Quispamsis

Jacqui Whiting and Sheila Henry, In Attendance

Sheila Henry, from 63 Peat Drive, thanked Council for the opportunity to share her concerns in relation to the proposed Amendment 023-1 of the Noise Bylaw.

She presented the following issues:

- Believes that the outbreaks of the use of consumer fireworks are in pockets of neighbourhoods; in her neighbourhood there has been 8 separate occurrences since June 30th, 2015;
- Makes note of Section 3.B.v in Draft Bylaw and wonders how this will be controlled;
- Referenced 'Letters to Editor from the Telegraph Journal' that were submitted to Council:
- Notes other municipalities who have banned fireworks;
- Has concerns about the enforcement, the associated fines not being strong enough and the absence of mention of fire bans from the Bylaw;
- Asking Council to consider a ban of consumer fireworks and better communicate with the residents who have to deal with the problem on a day to day basis.

Jacqui Whiting (Doncaster Drive), in attendance, expressed concerns regarding the noise and nuisance from fireworks in her neighbourhood which has caused difficulty in sleeping and smoke from fireworks drifting into windows.

She went on to say that she would like to see Quispamsis take a closer look at this bylaw and make further restrictions to the following area:

- specific locations where fireworks are permitted;
- specific days in which fireworks are permitted ie. holidays
- set stronger fines;

identify specifically who will enforce it.

Mayor Driscoll thanked Jacqui Whiting and Sheila Henry for their presentation.

5.3 2014 Audited Financial Statements - Peter Logan, In Attendance

Mr. Logan presented the Town of Quispamsis' 2014 Audited Financial Statements noting this is the 3rd year the statements were prepared under the PSAB accounting standards. He stated the Annual Surplus in the General Fund amounted to \$1,214,857, and it is important to note that \$1,199,050 was due to Gas tax Funds received in 2014. Under PSAB accounting rules, capital grants have been included in revenue. In the former accounting model, this surplus would have been recorded as \$14,327 in the General Operating Fund, as the capital grants would not have been included in the surplus amount.

The Utility Fund reflected an annual surplus of \$70,138. Mr. Logan noted the Town's debt ratio in the General Fund is 12%, well below the 20% threshold imposed by the Province, while the Utility Fund's debt ratio is 42%, also below the 50% threshold recommended by the Province.

The Town's Consolidated Revenue for 2014 totaled \$23,905,706; with \$19,441,242 of this amount being the property tax warrant, up approximately two (2) percent from 2013. After expenses, the surplus was \$1,214,857.

In closing, Mr. Logan stated the PSAB model has created very useful information concerning the Town's assets, and will be particularly helpful when preparing future capital budgets. He stated the Town's 2014 audited financial statements represent a clean audit in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards.

Staff Report from Director of Engineering & Works - Mr. Losier's Staff Report informed Council, as requested at the June 16, 2015 Regular Meeting, that staff has reviewed the program budget and timelines and have identified the reconstruction and resurfacing of Stoneyplain Avenue as the most suitable candidate street to bring to the current program.

The staff report indicated since Stoneyplain is in close proximity to streets they have yet to complete, the addition of this proposed street should not

present any issues other than a slight extension to the completion deadline.

- · Differentiate between Display fireworks and Consumer fireworks;
- To set a specific time frame for the use of consumer fireworks;
- To set specific locations for the use of and/or prohibition of consumer fireworks;

- · To set safety parameters for the use of consumer fireworks; and
- To change the penalty section to allow the Town, Police or the Fire Department to write tickets for violations.

Council Members spoke to the amendments, noting the concerns and comments expressed by residents, acknowledging that there were some good points brought up during earlier presentation and in letters received by Council, several noting fire bans.
