- 5.1 <u>Emergency Measures Organization, In Attendance, Brian Shanks, EMO Director</u>

Mr. Shanks provided an overview of the Emergency Measures Organization, specifically making note of upcoming events and training, as follows:

- EMO event @ qplex October 1st, 2015 An Emergency Preparedness
 Public Information Session has been scheduled for October 1st at the
 qplex. Speakers include: Red Cross, KRPF, KVFD. The meeting is a
 completion of the promise that was made last October to review
 emergency preparedness for winter activities. Information about safe
 winter driving, winter fire prevention and family emergency planning will be
 provided.
- EMO Table Top Exercise "Let it Snow— 2015" October 23rd, 2015 The design format will be based on a winter storm exercising warning, impact and response phases. An exercise design team will be formed and comprised of representatives from town departments, CN Rail, Red Cross, KRPF, KVFD, NBEMO. The scope of the exercise is the testing in a valuation of the towns capability to respond to a blizzards similar to the one that occurred on December 2013.
- Basic Emergency Management (BEM) training session will be scheduled for Fall.

Mr. Shanks gave an overview of the Sentinel System, an "Emergency Alert Service" offered by the town of Quispamsis. This service will allow staff to quickly

notify residents, by email or phone, of a potential emergency such as flooding, fire, a boil water order, etc.

He also noted that in order to receive notification through this service, residents need to register. They are always actively encouraging people to sign up on the Town's website and through social media.

Council members thanked Mr. Shanks for years of hard work and for being a dedicated supporter of EMO in Quispamsis.

The class runs 5 days a week (Monday-Friday) from 8:30 am – 3:00pm
