2. Mayor's Comments

<u>2017 Boston Marathon</u> - Mayor Clark acknowledged Quispamsis resident, Shelley Doucet placed 29th amongst all women in last weekend's 2017 Boston Marathon. She ran the 42 kilometers in two hours, 45 minutes and 46 seconds, besting the previous record for a NB woman, which was set by Paula Keating of Mirimichi six years ago.

Mayor Clark further acknowledged Town Employee, Wes Bennett, also participated for his second time, in this year's Boston Marathon.

<u>Electronics Products Recycling Association</u> – Mayor Clark noted the Electronics Products Recycling Association, in collaboration with Recycle NB, has launched a new recycling program that is intended to keep end of life electronics out of NB landfills. This includes televisions, computer monitors, cell phones, etc., which can be recycled at Valley Redemption Centre on Market Street, off Millennium Drive.

<u>Cleaner-Greener Quispamsis</u> - Mayor Clark reminded those available April 19, 2017 will mark the 14th Annual Cleaner Greener garbage pick-up in Quispamsis, and encouraged those available to participate. Drop off bins for litter for residents are available Monday at the Quispamsis Memorial Arena and the parking lot at James Rolfe Field.
