2. Mayor's Comments – Mayor Driscoll referenced the Let's Colour the City with Warmth Event that was held last Saturday in the Arts & Culture Park, led by mother-daughter team, Betty Russell and Jessica LeBlanc, who presented before Council last month. He

noted there are scarves and other winter-wear in the Park for those in need, adding he was pleased to present a donation of food and clothing that were donated by Town Staff.

5. Presentations

5.1 <u>Attendance Matters - Presentation by Ms. Zoe Watson, School Superintendent,</u> <u>Anglophone South School District</u>

Ms. Watson made presentation to Council on the Anglophone South School District's Attendance Matters Initiative. She informed Council data between the years 2013 and 2015 reflect that average absenteeism rates for both male and female students from K - Grade 8, was 5.7%. During this same timeframe for high school students, the absenteeism rate averaged 18.1%, with male students showing slightly higher absences than female students. This data identifies the need for a focus on attendance, which has been added to the District Improvement Plan. Several focus groups consisting of principals, vice-principals and students were formed to review this matter. Through this process, those involved learned that —

- 1. Students need to feel they belong and are part of the school community;
- Teachers can make a huge difference;
- Teachers can help if students get behind;
- 4. When teachers care, students do not want to disappoint them by not coming to school.

The goal of the Attendance Matters initiative, first launched in September of 2015, is to promote awareness of the importance of school attendance and being on time. All schools will have an attendance strategy as part of their School Improvement plan with continued focus on positive behavior intervention support, mental health and fitness. The students need to feel connected and welcome at their schools, Ms. Watson concluded, noting they are our future, and our future employees.

Council Members commended the ASD-S's proactive approach for the Attendance Matters Initiative, which forms good life habits.

5.2 <u>Kennebecasis Valley High School - Work Room - In Attendance, Jean Smith Re</u> Job Fair for High School Summer Students

Ms. Smith made presentation to Council to bring awareness of the eight (8) workrooms that operate in southwestern NB, which are funded through the Government of Canada and Province of NB Labour Market Agreements. The local KVHS Workroom is open year round, 8:15 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday, and will provide career related services to anyone of employable age. They assist with writing resumes, cover letters, identifying transferable skills, job searching, interview skills, and scholarship and bursary applications including research schools or programs of interest. All services are free, including use of their printer, scanner, and fax machines.

Ms. Smith stated the KV High School Summer Student Job Fair will be held Tuesday, March 15 at KVHS from 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., and asked the Town if it could provide them with two local employers as the Job Fair will present an opportunity to connect local high school talent with local employers.

8.1 Financing of Tender Awarded for Loader and Attachments - Tender No. 2015TQ12-30

8.1.1 Staff Report from Town Treasurer Re Financing of Tender No. 2015TQ12-30 - Loader & Attachments

Ms. McGraw's Staff Report informed Council, further to the January 19, 2016 Regular Meeting, Atlantic Tractors and Equipment Limited advised they had made an error in their pricing, and therefore wished to withdraw their Option 2 - Lease to Own portion of their bid. The monthly lease price was originally quoted as Tax Included in error, and should have been stated as Tax Extra. This error would mean a difference over seven years of \$55,000.

Ms. McGraw related Staff has considered other available options for financing, and has contacted two other leasing companies, but the least rate at 4.45% and monthly payments were still higher than the revised bid. If Atlantic Tractors and Equipment's Option 1 is considered for an outright purchase of the equipment at \$413,900 plus 13% HST, financing could be acquired through the Municipal Capital Borrowing Board. This option would provide a better rate for the Town as the average interest rate on a 7 year debenture is 2.23%. Over the 7 year term, this option would save the Town approximately \$37,000 due to the lower interest rates and elimination of non-refundable HST on monthly lease payments.

11.1 <u>Debenture Refinancing - Staff Report from Town Treasurer</u>

The Town Treasurer related on June 13, 2006 the Utility Fund received a debenture from the NB Municipal Finance Corporation in the amount of \$2,300,000. The debenture was issued for repayment over a 20 year period, with \$1,304,000 to be refinanced at the end of the first 10 years. At this time, the Town Treasurer recommended applying for refinancing of this debenture for the final 10 years, noting this item has been planned and budgeted in the 2016 Utility Operating Fund Budget.
