5.1 NB Power's Presentation Re Building a Smarter Grid - Lori Clark, Senior Vice-President of Operations and Bob Scott, Director, Public Relations, NB Power - In Attendance

Ms. Lori Clark made presentation to Council on NB Power's recent application to the NB Energy & Utilities Board to Build a Smarter Grid to provide customers with online access to detailed energy information and to provide quicker reconnection service. The business case demonstrates for this approximate \$92 million project, a positive net present value of \$31.1 million. It is one of the ways NB Power plans to modernize the power grid to improve energy efficiencies and to provide the best possible service, new benefits and opportunities into the future. The Energy & Utilities Board's final decision on this capital initiative is expected within the next month.

Ms. Clark noted the current metering system only provides the amount of electricity used per month, whereas the smart meters will provide customers daily, if they choose, with a breakdown of their power consumption usage. Also, there is an option for users to receive through their smart phones, notifications when their power consumption has reached certain thresholds, to help customers reduce their energy usage, noting what gets measured gets managed.

Additionally, the new smart meters will enable NB Power to do remote reconnects and disconnects so trucks would not need to be dispatched. There will be no charge to customers for the installation of the smart meters which are currently being piloted in the Town of Shediac, and are being used in 80% of Provinces across Canada.

8.1 (Nov.5/19) A. E. McKay Builders – 309 Hampton Road – Proposed Amendment to Section 59 Community Planning Act Development Agreement

A Staff Report from the Municipal Planning Officer informed Council, further to Mr. McKay's request to Council to postpone the December 17, 2019 Public Hearing, that he now wishes to continue with an amendment to the original development agreement to change the timelines and bonding allocation for the project. The requested timeline is 22 months with an anticipated start up by March 2, 2020, and a projected completion date by January 1, 2022. The change in the bonding allocation involves the water and sanitary sewerage which has been completed by the Town to service the property.

The original agreement had required the developer to pay the connection from the Old Coach Road to 309 Hampton Road, however, since that time, the Town has already completed the connection. The bonding in the revised agreement will reflect the amount Mr. McKay is required to reimburse the Town. Mr. McKay, in response to PAC and Council's request that the site be cleaned up by January 31, 2020; has stated his crew will be onsite the week of February 3, 2020, to prepare the site for foundation work and cleaning up any rubbish and debris on the site.

Minister Trevor Holder's letter was written in response to the Town's letter of November 28, 2019 in support of the Cities of NB Association's position re binding arbitration for firefighters and police officers. The Minister confirmed a bill was introduced by the government on November 22, 2019, which provides for

legislative amendments to the *Industrial Relations Act*. This, the Minister wrote, will allow all interested parties to present their views regarding the substance and scope of the proposed amendments.
