 - 9.1 New Brunswick Energy & Utilities Board Capital Project for Automated Metering Infrastructure Request for Support Letter from Town of Quispamsis

Correspondence from NB Power Corporation provided background information on their Advanced Metering Infrastructure Capital Project currently before the NB Energy & Utilities Board. Ms. McKay's email stated with the importance of the project benefiting NB communities, NB Power is asking municipalities to consider voicing their support by sending a letter to the Energy & Utilities Board by the end of the hearing date, January 22, 2020.

10.1 <u>Proposed By-law Amendment No. 005-19; A By-law of the Municipality of</u>
Quispamsis Respecting Sewerage Utility

12.1 <u>Fundy Region Service Commission's Decision re Single Use Plastic Bag</u>
Recycling & Request for Plastic Bag Reduction By-law

Letter from Marc MacLeod, Ex. Dir., Fundy Regional Service Commission & Further Update from Mayor Gary Clark

A discussion of Council ensued in response to Mr. MacLeod's notice of decision that the Fundy Region Service Commission, at its December 10, 2019 Meeting, passed a motion to remove plastic bags as an acceptable item in recycling, effective March 1, 2020. Additionally, the Commission passed a second motion recommending the Fundy Region municipalities adopt a Plastic Bag Reduction Bylaw, similar to the By-laws passed in Moncton, Riverview, Dieppe and the Provincial legislation in PEI.

The FRSC be requested to continue to accept single use plastic bags in the Recycling Program beyond the March 1, 2020 deadline date to prevent them from ending up in the landfill, and further, the FRSC be directed to work with UMNB in their approach to the Province of New Brunswick, (as per UMNB's resolution passed last October), requesting the implementation of a provincial-wide ban on single use plastic bags, similar to what PEI has successfully done, and the Town's MLA, Premier Blaine Higgs and the Minister of Environment& Local Government be copied on same.

13. Business Arising from Committee of the Whole

13.1 (Sept.17/19) Proposed Agreement with Canada Games Aquatic Centre for Lifeguard & Swimming Lesson Instruction Services

A Staff Report from the Director of Community Services recommended to Council the Canada Games Aquatic Centre be commissioned to provide lifeguarding and swimming lessons at the qplex, expanding the service they've been providing at Meenan's Cove Beach and Gondola Point Beach over the past nine (9) years. She noted the Town has been pleased with their level of service, and acknowledged the challenge the Town has each summer in recruiting and retaining lifeguards at the qplex pool. The qplex/QMA Manager would be responsible for managing the contract, and the CGAC would provide an onsite supervisor who would be responsible for both beaches and the pool.

Council authorize the signing of an agreement with the Canada Games Aquatic Centre to provide lifeguarding and swimming lesson instruction at the qplex pool

in 2020 for a fee of \$151,800 including HST, with an option to renew for two additional years.
