2. Mayor's Comments

Mayor Clark announced the Royal Canadian Legion has named Debbie Sullivan as this year's National Silver Cross Mother. Debbie's son, Navy Lieutenant Chris Saunders, was killed in a submarine fire while serving the country aboard the HMCS Chicoutimi in 2004, just 32 years old. Chris grew up in Quispamsis and graduated from KVHS the same year, Mayor Clark noted, as he did. Many in the community knew Chris and his family and had

a personal connection with him. Chris Saunders Memorial Elementary School was named after Chris, a tribute to his sacrifice and legacy.

Mayor Clark encouraged everyone to get out and get their poppy and give generously to the local Legion which has seen many of its normal fundraising efforts curtailed due to COVID-19. He noted he participated in the annual launch of the Poppy campaign at the Kennebecasis legion last week. As there will not be a formal ceremony at the qplex on Remembrance Day this year, he encouraged everyone to take a moment to pause and reflect on the memory of those like Chris Saunders and the other brave women and men who have made the ultimate sacrifice on behalf of all Canadians.

8. Unfinished Business

8.1 Revised Proposed 2021 Budget - (Includes Council Decisions from October 24, 2020 Special Budget Meeting)

Ms. Brandon expanded upon her Staff Report included with the Revised Budget Document highlighting the changes that were made by Council consensus at the October 24, 2020 Special Meeting. The summary of all the changes now propose a tax rate for 2021 of 1.3428 which is the same tax rate as 2020 for a total budget of \$26,394,801. This also includes the extra \$15,000 allocated towards traffic safety, as per Councillor Miller's email request to double this budget from \$15,000 to \$30,000 to allow for the purchase of more flashing signs, speed monitor signs, etc. to improve traffic safety.

Councillor Rioux stated he will be voting against the proposed 2021 budget primarily based on his displeasure of not suspending the allocation of \$173,088 for the COMEX Public Transit service for 2021 for further review in 2022. His view is based on the low ridership of the bus service, stating he feels this money would be better spent on the Town's street upgrade program.

CAO Deuville and Councillor Miller noted they serve on the Town's Ad Hoc Transportation Committee, along with Councillor Olsen, and will be further analyzing the COMEX Service once the ridership and final budget numbers are received from Saint John Transit. If there is a will to change the current Comex Service as a result of this pending information, the Ad Hoc Committee will bring this matter back to Council, noting by allocating the \$173,088 in the proposed 2021 budget, at this time, serves as a placeholder.
