Radar Units on Kensington Avenue

QUISPAMSIS – If you travel along Kensington Avenue, you have probably noticed the addition of two speed-detection signs.

Kensington Avenue is used as a shortcut by many, and local residents have complained about speeding. The signs will show drivers how fast they are going.

The Kennebecasis Regional Police Force has a mobile unit which it places at many locations throughout Quispamsis and Rothesay. It has been successful in reducing speeding in problem areas.

“These units will monitor traffic speeds and flows,” said Gary Losier, the town’s Director of Engineering and Works. “The information we gather will be compiled and shared with the police.”

Town Council has reduced the maximum speed limit on Kensington Avenue to 40 km/hr. On school days, in the area near Lakefield Elementary, the speed limit is further reduced to a maximum of 30 km/hr.

The units will be operational as of Monday, Aug. 17.
