## *Quispamsis establishes brush drop*

QUISPAMSIS – Residents of Quispamsis can take brush from post-Tropical Storm Arthur to Renforth Construction at no cost to themselves.

People who show proof of residency at Town Hall will receive a drop-off coupon, which they must present when they take their brush to Renforth Construction, located at 91 Palmer Brook Road. There is a limit of one coupon per household, and all coupons must be redeemed no later than July 19.

“Like many other parts of New Brunswick, our town was hit hard by the storm,” said Mayor Murray Driscoll. “Our residents have asked that this service be provided by the town.”

Smaller brush can be composted through a home owner’s private waste-removal provider.

Meantime, shower facilities will be available at the qplex again on Thursday morning for residents who are still without power.

People will be able to shower at the qplex from 6:30 a.m. to 9 a.m. Dressing room No. 5 will be available for males while females will have access to the two officials’ rooms.

The Quispamsis Civic Centre, above Fire Station No. 2, will also be open again from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Thursday for people to charge their electronic devices and get water. People are asked to bring their own water containers.
